Proposition No. 1 Replacement of Expiring Levy for Educational Programs and Operations

Ballot Title

The Board of Directors of Brinnon School District approved Resolution No. 277-21 authorizing an educational programs and operations replacement levy. The proposition would fund instructional programs beyond the state minimum instructional offerings, staffing ratios, program components, professional learning allocations, student and program support, and school operations for the District's educational programs and operational expenses, including facility maintenance and student transportation. The approximate levy rates will be adjusted as provided in Section 1 of Resolution No. 277-21.

Explanatory Statement

The Brinnon School District requests voter approval of a replacement educational programs and operations levy of \$664,612 to be collected in the two-year period from 2023 to 2024. Passage of Proposition No. 1 would replace an expiring levy of taxes to enable the District to pay for its educational maintenance and operations, including teaching, school supplies, activities, transportation and facility maintenance and operations. The current educational programs and operations levy expires this year. Absent approval of this levy, the District will have insufficient funds from the State to enable the District to pay for certain educational programs previously funded by proceeds from the District's expiring educational programs and operations levy.

Statement For

Our committee fully supports the Brinnon School District EP&O Levy.

The District has demonstrated exceptional good judgment and management in the area of the District budget. Rather than quickly ask taxpayers for funding in the form of a Capital Improvement Levy or a Bond, the District invests a great deal of time and effort seeking grants to pay for facilities improvements and other initiatives. This work at seeking grants helps the District to maintain the lowest school tax rate in the County. The FOR Committee respects and appreciates this effort, which is most recently evidenced by the new grant funded modular building that will house two classrooms. The FOR Committee recognizes the value of this respect for the taxpayers of Brinnon. The Committee appreciates the quality school district the Brinnon community enjoys.
