



# Septic System Inspection Rebate Program



## What is the Rebate Program?

### Who qualifies?

Single family residences in Jefferson County whose septic system was installed prior to 2007 are eligible.

### Why would I need this?

Regular inspections help prevent septic system failures. Risers and lids make the septic system easier to inspect later. That means protecting public health and improving water quality for everyone.

Up to **\$350** rebate for your septic system's

- First monitoring inspection
- Tank pumping (if need documented by certified professional)
- Minor tank repairs, such as tank sealing, replacement of tank baffles.
- Installation of risers, lids, and/or effluent filter.

Rebates must be accompanied with a site visit by a JCPH inspector.

**Program is in effect until funds have been exhausted**

## How does this work?

**The following qualifications are required for all septic system rebates.**

### **You must:**

- Have a private residence in Jefferson County
- Have a system that was installed prior to 2007
- Have an inspection or installation of risers, lids, and/or effluent filter , minor repair or pumping done by a Certified/Licensed provider (list available online or you can call the Health Department for list of providers).
- Pay for the services. Keep your receipt or paid invoice. Rebate will not exceed invoice/receipt.
- Submit the application with documentation of the work done to the Health Department.
- **Work must be done after July 1, 2019**

**ONE** inspection rebate per property

**ONE** rebate for risers, lids, **minor repair**, and/or effluent filter installation or pumping per property

Rebates are for work done **after** July 2019 **and** Septic systems installed **prior** to 2007

Rebates are not allowed for Time of Sale Inspections.

Private residences only

Sorry, but previous rebate recipients are not eligible to receive another **inspection or pumping** rebate.

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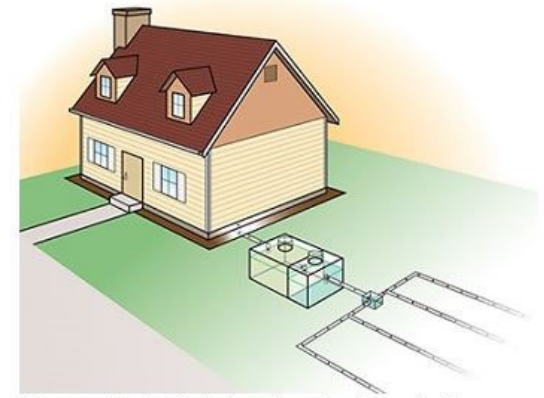
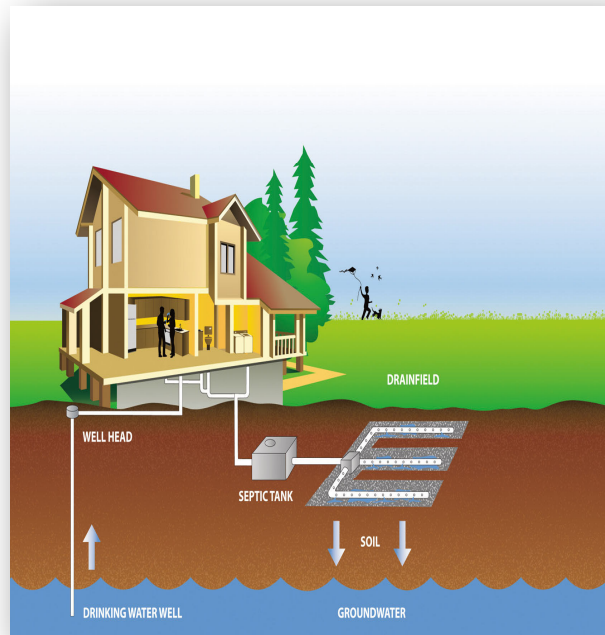


Diagram of a Septic System for a Single Family Home
