Jefferson Family Pharmacy ... (360) 385-3005

Family Pharmacy's employees are delivering medications to outlying areas on their way home from work. No delivery charges. This includes Quilcene, Sequim, Discovery Bay, and down to the Hood Canal Bridge area. They can only deliver to Quilcene on weekdays. They ask for at least one-day notice, please.

QFC Pharmacy in Port Hadlock ... (360) 385-1070

They are offering to mail prescriptions with no postal charges at this time. They are working with a delivery service and hope to have something in place in about 2 weeks for in-person delivery.

## TIPS FOR KEEPING YOURSELF & GROCERY STORES AS SAFE AS POSSIBLE

- Limit the number of times you go to a grocery store to once a week or less. Shop at times when the stores are less crowded and use a list to eliminate browsing.

- Consider wearing a cloth face mask to protect others.
- Wash your hands or use hand sanitizer after handling money.
- Use hand sanitizer when you get in the car and wash your hands thoroughly when you get home.
